Schaps OR Near mishaps

- ***** Report all mishaps to the instructor
- * Mishap
 - Any event that results in personnel injury or property damage, no matter how slight.

***** Near Mishap

- Any event that could result in personnel injury or property damage but is avoidable
- ***** Unsafe condition
 - Situation, procedure that you believe could cause injury

SAFETY MISHAP INVESTIGATION

The CNE Safety Officer will conduct a safety investigation of every Mishap whether deemed major or minor

* The immediate supervisor or senior instructor present at the time of a training mishap will immediately notify the chain of command and initiate a safety investigation.
