

 - -Ladders & Handrails -Fire Stations

Labeling, Classification and Numbering

- Piping and Ventilation Ducting
- Frame / Bulkhead Penetrations
- Valves / Handwheels
- Doors, Hatches and Scuttles
- First Aid Boxes
- Fire Stations
- Photolum Paint or 3M Stickers
- Traffic Markings
- Deck Drains

Electrical

 Check Cables, Junction Boxes, Terminal Boxes, SP Phone Equip, Loose Cabling



Portable Fire Extinguishers

- Tamper Seals
- Labels Correct
- Dry Rot in Hose
- <u>**PKP</u>**: Powder not caked</u>
- <u>CO2</u>: Hydro Date, Electrical Tape
- <u>AFFF</u>: Pressure Gage in Green Zone



Fire Stations

- Spanner Wrenches
- Wye Gates
- Hoses Stowed Properly
- Hydro Dates
 Current



Other Areas...

- Ladders/ Handrails
 - -Treads
 - -Safety Chains
 - -Handrails Tight
 - -Toggle Pins
- Flam Storage
 - -Warnings/Labels -Self-Closing Drip Trave
 - -Drip Trays
 - -Current Inventory



More Stuff...

- Deck Drains
 - -Screws
 - -Hairballs, Paint Chips, Verdigris
- Battle Lanterns
 -Sat OPTEST
 - -Wiring
 - -Mounting Bracket



Ventillation

- Preheaters and Reheaters:
 - Cleanliness
- Exhaust:
 - Flame Arrstors, HF Alarms
- Recirc:
 - Cooling Coils Clean
 - Fire Dampers Fully Closed

Black Oxide Coated Brass Threaded Fasteners (BOCBTF)



BOCBTF... Very Dangerous!!!

 SFR 2-95 Introduced a New Maintenance Check to Ensure that no BOCBTF could be used in a Level 1 Steam Service System.

 Check is a Situational Requirement to be Performed Whenever a Mechanical Joint is Disturbed or the Lagging Removed.

Watertight Integrity



Current Issues

• <u>INSURV 98</u>: 33% of WTD's, WTH's and WTS's not watertight!!!!!

 <u>Biggest Problem</u>: Aluminum Weatherdeck Doors... soaking up nearly 50% of Repair Money

Solutions

- <u>Onboard Maintenance Training</u>: -Available at NO COST through TYCOM's
 - -1 to 2 weeks of hands-on training
 -About 50 Closures fixed
